In their strategic locations, these artworks utilize a normally benign advertising space to reflect upon notions of South Florida, international commerce, and existing art world structures. The shelter posters together function as a site-specific exhibition that will be displayed for one month to passers-by, public transit patrons, and the occasional, intentional, art-seeking viewer. During and after the many art fairs have retreated from the city, the exhibition route will continue to be accessible by car or bus service.
